I am writing this recommendation on behalf of John Gardner. I have known John for approximately ten years and have had the opportunity to work with him closely during this entire time, first when he became a community member of the Huntington College Wind Ensemble (which I direct), and then as an adjunct faculty member of our music department.

John is a valued member of our department, performing in our ensembles (on clarinet and saxophone) and teaching applied clarinet.
